SHALL DOUGLAS COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT, NUMBER RE1 DEBT BE INCREASED \$200,000,000, WITH A REPAYMENT COST OF \$362,762,000 AND SHALL DISTRICT TAXES BE INCREASED \$18,404,000 ANNUALLY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING SCHOOLS AND CLASSROOMS THROUGHOUT THE COMMUNITY AND TO REDUCE RELIANCE ON PORTABLE TRAILERS, WHICH MAY INCLUDE BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING: 6 NEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS; 1 NEW MIDDLE SCHOOL; 2 NEW CAREER TECHNICAL REGIONAL FACILITIES; REMODELING/RENOVATING 6 ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS, 1 MIDDLE SCHOOL, AND 1 HIGH SCHOOL; ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, PURCHASING, ENLARGING, IMPROVING, REMODELING, REPAIRING AND MAKING ADDITIONS TO SCHOOL BUILDINGS, ACQUIRING REAL PROPERTY, AND EQUIPPING OR FURNISHING SCHOOL BUILDINGS; AND SHALL THE MILL LEVY BE INCREASED IN ANY YEAR, WITHOUT LIMITATION OF RATE AND IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM, IF ANY, AND INTEREST ON SUCH DEBT OR ANY REFUNDING DEBT (OR TO CREATE A RESERVE FOR SUCH PAYMENT), SUCH DEBT TO BE EVIDENCED BY THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS BEARING INTEREST AT A MAXIMUM NET EFFECTIVE INTEREST RATE NOT TO EXCEED 6.5%; SUCH BONDS TO BE SOLD IN ONE SERIES OR MORE, FOR A PRICE ABOVE OR BELOW THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF SUCH SERIES, ON TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND WITH SUCH MATURITIES AS PERMITTED BY LAW AND AS THE DISTRICT MAY DETERMINE, INCLUDING PROVISIONS FOR REDEMPTION OF THE BONDS PRIOR TO MATURITY WITH OR WITHOUT PAYMENT OF THE PREMIUM OF NOT TO EXCEED THREE PERCENT; AND SHALL THE DISTRICT BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE DEBT TO REFUND THE DEBT AUTHORIZED IN THIS QUESTION PROVIDED THAT SUCH REFUNDING DEBT, ALONG WITH ANY OTHER DEBT INCURRED BY THE DISTRICT PURSUANT TO THIS AUTHORIZATION, IS ISSUED ON TERMS WHICH DO NOT EXCEED THE PRINCIPAL, INTEREST AND REPAYMENT COSTS AUTHORIZED IN THIS QUESTION; AND SHALL SUCH TAX REVENUES AND THE EARNINGS FROM THE INVESTMENT OF SUCH BOND PROCEEDS AND TAX REVENUES BE COLLECTED, RETAINED AND SPENT AS A VOTER APPROVED REVENUE CHANGE UNDER ARTICLE X, SECTION 20 OF THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION OR ANY OTHER LAW?
