

Section 1.4.2

Revision clarifies that pavement repair, resurfacing, graveling or re-grading that does not materially change the original vertical or horizontal alignment or original width of public and private roadways and driveways is exempt from the GESC Permit Program.

Section 1.4.2 states in part;

- ◆ *Routine agricultural practices, including tilling, planting, harvesting, or livestock operations. (Activities not considered as routine agricultural practices, and therefore requiring a GESC Permit, include land grading and work in or adjacent to streams and drainage channels.)*
- ◆ *Pavement repair, resurfacing, graveling or re-grading that does not materially change the original vertical or horizontal alignment or original width of public and private roadways and driveways.* (Although a GESC Permit is not required, erosion and sediment control BMPs and a Right-of-Way *Use and Construction* Permit, *for public roadways*, are required.)
- ◆ *Emergency situations that pose an imminent risk to life or property, such as hazardous waste clean-up operations and fire.*
- ◆ *Livestock grazing.*
- ◆ *Mowing.*
- ◆ *Weed control.*
- ◆ *Burning.*
- ◆ *Irrigation and associated activities (including: operation and maintenance of irrigation facilities; ditch maintenance and pumping; and maintenance, operation and construction of diversions and headgate structures).*
- ◆ *Fencing and maintenance of existing fencing.”*
