Amendments of the State Constitution

Ballot issues referred by the general assembly or any political subdivision are listed by letter, and ballot issues initiated by the people are listed numerically. A ballot issue listed as an "amendment" proposes a change to the Colorado constitution, and a ballot issue listed as a "proposition" proposes a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes. A "yes" vote on any ballot issue is a vote in favor of changing current law or existing circumstances, and a "no" vote on any ballot issue is a vote against changing current law or existing circumstances.

Amendment 60 (CONSTITUTIONAL)
Shall there be an amendment to the Colorado constitution concerning government charges on property, and, in connection therewith, allowing petitions in all districts for elections to lower property taxes; specifying requirements for property tax elections; requiring enterprises and authorities to pay property taxes but offsetting the revenues with lower tax rates; prohibiting enterprises and unelected boards from levying fees or taxes on property; setting expiration dates for certain tax rate and revenue increases; requiring school districts to reduce property tax rates and replacing the revenue with state aid; and eliminating property taxes that exceed the dollar amount included in an approved ballot question, that exceed state property tax laws, policies, and limits existing in 1992 that have been violated, changed, or weakened without state voter approval, or that were not approved by voters without certain ballot language?

ORDINANCE NO. ____ AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CASTLE PINES NORTH ABOLISHING THE CASTLE PINES URBAN RENEWAL AUTHORITY WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 10-27, the City Council of the City of Castle Pines North formed the Castle Pines Urban Renewal Authority, also referred to in the City's documents as the Castle Pines North Urban Renewal Authority; and WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 10-46, the Castle Pines Urban Renewal Authority adopted an urban renewal plan; and WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 31-25-115(2), an urban renewal authority may be abolished by ordinance, provided that adequate arrangements have been made for payment of any outstanding indebtedness and other obligations of the urban renewal authority; and WHEREAS, the Castle Pines Urban Renewal Authority has no outstanding indebtedness or other obligations. NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Castle Pines North, Colorado: Section 1. The Castle Pines Urban Renewal Authority, also known as the Castle Pines North Urban Renewal Authority, is hereby abolished, pursuant to C.R.S. § 31-25-115(2). Section 2. Severability. If any part, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason judicially determined to be invalid or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remaining provisions of this Ordinance, the intention being that the various provisions are severable. Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after publication following final passage without alteration by the City Council of the City of Castle Pines North, or if the City Council fails to adopt this Ordinance within twenty (20) days following the final determination of initiative petition sufficiency, upon approval by the majority of the registered electors of the City of Castle Pines North voting on the measure at an election held for that purpose.
