# Community Needs Assessment 

Douglas County, Colorado

September 2020

## 1. Executive Summary

COVID 19 has caused a significant increase in the number of residents requesting assistance to meet their basic needs. Housing, utilities and food have been identified by low-income residents as the top three direct services needed to achieve self-sufficiency. The increased number of residents also requires a more robust system of collaboration between human service organizations to prevent duplication of service and improve access to care. Significant CARES Act funding has been made available, in the near-term, to assist local human service non-profit organizations and provide additional direct support to vulnerable residents. Due to the evolving nature of the COVID 19 pandemic, Douglas County is limiting the scope of the 2020 Community Needs Assessment to 1 year. This will allow local leadership the opportunity to consider the short-term needs faced residents and further evaluate the long-term impact of COVID in the coming year.

## 2. Evaluation of Past Performance and Environmental Scan

The 2017 Community Needs Assessment identified affordable housing, transportation, integrated care, wellbeing and childcare as the highest priority services needed by residents working to overcome the impact of poverty. The Community Action Plan identified Douglas County Cares, the Community of Care Network and the Community Data Project as the 2 programs which would support meeting these needs in 2018 - 2020. Since 2018322 people from 104 households have been served through emergency assistance and long-term case management through Douglas County Cares, 74 agencies have participated in providing integrated care through the Community of Care Network and 19 agencies now participate in the Community Data Project.

Through DC Cares 64\% of participants who have completed the program and obtained the outcome of achieving self-sufficiency in the past three years. This has been accomplished through case management, collaborative services and primarily, rent assistance and supportive housing. During the 2020 COVID 19 pandemic, additional resources have been made available to support emergency needs of customers. Through a partnership with a local human service non-profit 53 households have been provided with onetime rent assistance to ensure stable housing during the pandemic. Customer who received services in the last 3 years were provided an opportunity to complete and online survey. Although the response rate has been very low, a few comments from residents over the last three years include:
"I cannot thank you enough for helping me and my family during our time of need. Your generous assistance will allow me to avert eviction while searching for affordable housing option and maintaining my children's academic location."
"This Thanksgiving was just the kids and I but what made it all possible is the fact that we had furniture to eat it on. Thank you! All of the kids went around the table saying how thankful they are for you and for all that you've done for us and said thank you for bringing our family back together."

Those that did respond to the survey who received log-term case management and support did indicate that they "felt better off as a result of the services, supported in reaching their goals and felt valued as an individual." Respondent, who only received hotel vouchers and were still experiencing homelessness indicated that the assistance provided did not make them feel better off as a result of the services provided. This indicated the value of supported case management and the need to provide long-term solutions for those experiencing homelessness.

Since 2018 the Community Data project has increased from 5 initial partners to over 20 organizations that utilize the system to report and track services provided to vulnerable populations. The most significant outcome from this project was the utilization of data gathered over the last 3 years to track increased need during the COVID 19 pandemic. The data system was instrumental in capturing real time data from food banks across the county and comparing the volume of need to the previous year. These weekly reports resulted in additional assistance provided to foodbanks who had seen a quadrupling of their customer base during the height of the Stay at Home order.

Lastly, the strength of the Community of Care Network was critical to meeting the need of vulnerable residents during the pandemic. Within a couple weeks of onset, a workgroup focused on meeting the food, shelter and emergency needs of vulnerable residents was convened. The strength of the Network was apparent in the rapid response to the emerging needs of residents through cooperative sharing of resources and strategic planning to address emerging needs.

## 3. Geographic Area Covered by the Assessment

The assessment includes the county of Douglas, Colorado. This region is the southern-most county of the Denver metropolitan area. It is a mix of suburb and rural areas. Population centers include unincorporated Highlands Ranch, the city of Lone Tree and the towns of Castle Rock and Parker. Rural areas to the west and south include Roxborough, Franktown, Sedalia and Larkspur. As the southern-most region of the metro area, Douglas County serves as a bedroom community to Denver to the north and Colorado Springs to the south. Lack of transportation options between communities in Douglas County is the primary barrier faced. Castle Rock, the County seat and where the majority of human services are available, is not connected to the regional public transportation system.

## 4. Community Resources

Douglas County has a strong safety net system of care and regularly engages with multiple partners to serve low-income residents. This system of care is supported through the Community Data system, multiple collaborative program including the Community of Care Network, Douglas County Cares, Winter Weather Care, and recently the Human Needs Taskforce Food, Shelter and Emergency Assistance Workgroup. For a complete list of partners see Appendix A.

Recently, through local CARES Act funding, Douglas County has earmarked $\$ 2.5$ million to support nonprofit organizations, including providing financial support to organizations who provide direct services to
low-income individuals. The goal of this program is to strengthen the organizations who provide direct service and ensure their long-term ability to serve our vulnerable residents.

Secondly, the County has authorized the use of CARES Act funds to provide $\$ 1.5$ million in general assistance to residents impacted by COVID. Through the Department of Human Services, these funds will assist residents earning under $80 \%$ of the Area Median Income in paying their bills. Both of these programs will operate as funding is available or until the end of 2020.

Local CARES Act CSBG funding has been earmarked by the Tripartite Board to assist with rent and hotel vouchers. These funds will be held until 2021 to supplement the need for assistance once local CARES Act funding is no longer available. For these reasons, the 2020 Community Needs Assessment is being limited to a 1 year scope. This will allow local leadership and the Tripartite Board to better understand the lasting impact of COVID, especially after the local and CSBG CARES Act funds have been expended.

## 5. Data Analysis

Due to the ongoing impact of COVID 19 in Douglas County and on vulnerable residents, Douglas County has chosen to modify its approach to completing the 2020 Community Needs Assessment. It is the intention of the County to utilize this process to provide an interim Need Assessment for 2021 and will collaborate with the Community Development Block Grant Consolidated Plan process in 2020 and 2021 to create a more comprehensive and integrated plan to assist low-income residents.

For 2020, Douglas County gathered demographic data from the U.S. Census Bureau through the Community Action Partnership, service data from the Community Data System, intake surveys from residents seeking services at a local human service non-profit, surveys from residents at a local service event and hosted a key-informant forum with partners online.

According to 2018 American Community Survey the population of Douglas County is estimated to be 328,614 . Of those, $4.54 \%$, or 14,862 live under $125 \%$ of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). Due to the cost of housing in Douglas County, those who live below 200\% FPL are considered vulnerable. There are 29,241 living under $200 \%$ FPL. Although those who are Hispanic make up just over $8 \%$ of the total population, they consist of over $13 \%$ of those that live under poverty. Female head of house families total $39 \%$ of those who live under poverty.

The high cost of housing and the lack of available, affordable housing stock contribute to the barriers faced by low-income residents. Vacancy rates in the second quarter of 2019 were $0.2 \%$ or 258 units of housing out of 143,308 address. These low rates have been consistent dating back to 2017. Due to the impact of the COVID 19 Stay at Home issued in March of 2020, unemployment in Douglas county went from a 3 year average of $3 \%$ or less to $8.7 \%$ in June of 2020. These factors play a significant role in creating the conditions low-income residents face in Douglas as they work to achieve self-sufficiency.

Beginning in February 2020 Douglas County partnered with Help \& Hope Center to gather information from first time customers seeking services from their organization. Help \& Hope provides an array of service to meet the needs of low-income people. Since February, over 300 surveys have been collected. Customers were asked to select the 3 services most likely to help them reach self-sufficiency. The top three answers were housing assistance, utility assistance and food assistance. When asked what barriers existed to receiving help the top answer was, "Did not know where to go to receive help." A large number
of "other" answers were submitted. "COVID" and the "shut down" that resulted from the pandemic, were including in the top responses. Of those that responded, $60 \%$ had not ever asked for assistance in the past. Almost $80 \%$ of responses indicated that they did not receive traditional services such as SNAP from the County.

Similarly, 90 households who attended a resource event in July were surveyed. The event drew families from across the county in need of back to school supplies. The survey asked attendees to identify what services would assist their family. Again, food assistance, housing and help paying bills were 3 of the top 4 responses, the other being educational supplies.

In August, Douglas County hosted the Community of Care Network meeting and invited attendees to participate in a key informant survey. Attendees includes staff and volunteers from human service organization across the county. These included those from the non-profit, faith-based, government and education sectors. A total of 29 people participated in the process. This group identified housing, transportation, mental health services and paying bills as the 3 most needed resources for low-income residents. When asked what conditions had the greatest impact on one's ability to achieve self-sufficiency financial history, life skills and metal health were rated the highest. This is an indicator of the need to provide collaborative, case management services to low-income residents. When asked if they could do one thing to help people the most interesting answers included:

- "Education and access to resources that exist in the community BEFORE people are in crisis."
- "Help more long term"
- "Give hope"
- "Help develop and support self-efficacy and self-advocacy"


## 6. Key findings on the Causes and Conditions of Poverty

Douglas County has a relatively low poverty rate with less than 10,000 of our 350,000 residents living below the federal poverty limit. However, when you consider that almost $10 \%$ of the population lives under $200 \%$ FPL the number of residents living on the edge of poverty is significant. The fact the lowincome resident identified the need for assistance with housing, utilities and food suggest that even meting basic needs has become challenging for some, especially those who have lost income due to COVID. The tripling of unemployment due to COVID has placed additional pressure on the safety net system of care and caused a significant increase in the number of residents experiencing the conditions of poverty in Douglas County.

As a result, the need to continue to assist residents with their basic needs is critical at this time. This should include housing, utilities and food assistance at a minimum. For many, this may be the first time they are experiencing need and the knowledge barrier on where to turn to for help indicates the need to strengthen collaboration between agencies and build a more robust referral network. Finally, for many, the need for long-term support and case management is critical and programs that support the achievement of self-sufficiency will still be needed.

The top barrier indicated by residents that they did not know where to go to receive help demonstrates the high number of "new" users to the system of care. The need to strengthen communication and
collaboration with vulnerable residents and between agencies is necessary to ensure deduplication of services and reduce the number of residents who may fall through the safety net.

The following 3 needs should be considered in formulating plans to alleviate the current causes and conditions on poverty found in Douglas County.

1. Low income residents need assistance to meet their basic needs (including housing, utilities, and food).
2. Low income residents need collaborative services (including resource navigation and case management) to better access resources.
3. Agencies need collaborative tools to facilitate support of services to low-income residents

## Poverty Rate Change

Poverty rate change in the report area from 2000 to 2018 is shown below. According to the U.S. Census, the poverty rate for the area increased by $0.9 \%$, compared to a national increase of 2.1\%.

## Persons Receiving Medicare
