

## 2020 - Philip S. Miller Awards and Summary of Requests

Applicant	2020 Award	Description
<b>Backpack Society</b> <i>Weekend Food Program</i>	\$ 1,000	Funds will be used to purchase food & supplies for a weekend food program serving families with kids on free or reduced lunch programs at Thunder Ridge and its feeder schools.
<b>Bridge of Hope</b> <i>Self-Sufficiency Program</i>	\$ 2,000	Funds will serve families to provide rent assistance, case management & volunteer support to achieve self-sufficiency & prevent homelessness.
<b>CO Agriculture Leadership Foundation (CALF)</b> <i>Youth Leadership Dev. Program</i>	\$ 3,000	Ranch-based program includes youth leadership training, character development through volunteer activities & quality of life programs for people with special needs & mental health issues.
<b>Castle Rock Hospital Foundation</b> <i>Sources of Strength Program (Suicide Prevention)</i>	\$ 2,000	Costs associated with 3 suicide-prevention and youth resiliency programs will be used to raise awareness & increase skills around youth suicide prevention.
<b>Catholic Charities</b> <i>Support to Low-Income Individuals</i>	\$ 7,500	Funds will be used for direct services in the form of \$20 King Soopers gift cards that are restricted to gasoline purchases.
<b>Cherry Hills Community Church</b> <i>Rent and Utility Assistance</i>	\$ 3,500	Rent and utility assistance is provided to individuals through the Manna Connect program, engaging motivated clients through intensive coaching and skill development.
<b>Doctors Care</b> <i>Medical Care</i>	\$ 8,000	Funds will be used to support direct services for medical care and social services for income qualified underserved children and adults to improve health outcomes.
<b>Help &amp; Hope Center</b> <i>Rent and Utility Assistance</i>	\$ 19,500	Funding will be used to help prevent homelessness for at-risk, low-income residents, providing safety net services with rent and utility assistance.
<b>Hope's Promise</b> <i>Expectant Mothers Care Fund</i>	\$ 2,000	Programs serve expectant clients who decide to parent by helping them create stability in their lives through counseling, a parenting plan, & connection with community resources. The funds would provide limited financial aid through the Care Fund.
<b>Integrated Family Community Services</b> <i>Rent &amp; Utility Assistance</i>	\$ 2,000	IFCS provides clients with rent and utility assistance, limited case management and other services to help them achieve self-sufficiency. Programs supported include hunger and homeless prevention, enrichment programs and clothing assistance.
<b>Parker Task Force</b> <i>Rent, Utility &amp; Medical Assistance</i>	\$ 16,750	Clients in the northern and eastern portion of the County are assisted with food, evictions, utility shut offs, and medical needs.
<b>Performing Arts Academy</b> <i>Performance Scholarships</i>	\$ -	Funding will provide scholarships for at-risk children to participate in age appropriate musical and performance opportunities at the Academy.
<b>Ray of Hope Cancer Foundation</b> <i>Rent, Food &amp; Utility Assistance</i>	\$ 2,000	Funds will be used to assist 7 cancer patients with financial expenses such as rent, food and utility assistance and transportation.

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<b>Rosie's Ranch</b> <i>Coordinator Support</i>	\$ 1,000	Funds will be used to hire a part-time administrative volunteer coordinator and a direct services program supervisor to coordinate volunteer programs.
<b>Save Our Youth</b> <i>Mentoring Program</i>	\$ 3,000	Organization provides long-term one-on-one mentoring to address the growing disconnection & social pressures youth experience, and work towards suicide prevention.
<b>Second Wind</b> <i>Suicide Prevention</i>	\$ 4,500	Second Wind connects children and youth that have no other access to care and are at risk of suicide with licensed counselors. Funding will help pay for 12 sessions of life-saving therapy.
<b>SECOR Cares</b> <i>Mobile Food Bank</i>	\$ 5,000	A mobile market delivers food directly to people that otherwise have difficulty accessing services. Funding will provide 1 mobile market stop at \$1,000/month for the duration of a year.
<b>Sky Cliff Center</b> <i>Adult Day Care</i>	\$ 1,000	Adult day program funds are proposed to cover a portion of a new senior software program and outings for a stroke support group.
<b>Stride Community Health Center</b> <i>Pre-Natal &amp; Pediatric Health Care</i>	\$ 3,000	Eligible Medicaid or uninsured clients qualify for integrated prenatal and pediatric primary healthcare services on a sliding scale.
<b>St. Vincent de Paul - Castle Rock</b> <i>Rent, Utility &amp; Hygiene Assistance</i>	\$ 3,750	Funds will provide rent and utility assistance and hygiene products to low-income families in Castle Rock.
<b>St. Vincent de Paul - Parker</b> <i>Rent &amp; Utility Assistance</i>	\$ 2,000	Provides income-eligible families in northeastern Douglas County with direct rent and utility assistance.
<b>The Rock Real Community</b> <i>Food &amp; Shelter Program</i>	\$ 4,500	Funding will provide direct services such as food and transportation to the at-risk populations, with special emphasis on older adults.
<b>Whiz Kids</b> <i>One-on-One Tutoring Program</i>	\$ 1,500	The one-on-one tutoring program will provide low-income students at Pine Lane Elementary help to improve their literacy & social skills.
<b>You are not Alone Mom2Mom</b> <i>Support Group</i>	\$ -	Funds will be used to implement a supportive community network for new moms and help address postpartum depression.
<b>Y.E.S.S. Foundation (DCSO)</b> <b>(withdrawn)</b> <i>Youth Suicide Prevention Program</i>	\$ -	The Y.E.S.S. foundation trains community members in suicide prevention through workshops held in schools and local organizations, or by serving on suicide hotlines.
<b>Youth Seen</b> <i>Youth Summer Camp Program</i>	\$ 1,500	The virtual summer camp program offers transgender youth the opportunity to improve their coping skills and learn to address bullying and family issues in a healthy manner.

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<b>Aging Resources of Douglas County</b> <i>Senior Programming</i>	\$ 25,000	This award will facilitate transportation, in-home volunteer services & community outreach to help seniors age-in-place.
<b>Castle Rock Senior Center</b> <i>Senior Programming</i>	\$ 25,000	Funding will enhance services and programming for seniors at the Castle Rock Senior Center.
<b>DC Senior Services Foundation</b> <i>Senior Programming</i>	\$ 10,000	The Foundation grants small awards to local organizations serving seniors and these funds will match their fundraising activities up to \$10,000.
<b>Highlands Ranch Metro District</b> <i>Senior Programming</i>	\$ 15,000	Funding will support active adult programs & services and provide information and referrals to Highlands Ranch seniors.
<b>Parker Senior Center</b> <i>Senior Programming</i>	\$ 15,000	The grant will support nutritious meal programs and provide transportation to-and-from the Parker Senior Center.
