

- 434 families consisting of 528 children were served by Colorado Child Care Assistance Program (CCCAP) in 2024.
- \$4,706,894 in CCCAP benefits were paid in 2024 which represents a cost of \$8,915 per child.
- The child care team role is essential in partnering with various programs and services like child welfare and TANF to add to a families' stabilization and future success.
 - * Douglas County has implemented an enrollment freeze as of 12/1/24, and enrollment of new cases is temporarily closed.

Child Support

- Douglas County Child Support served 3,100 families.
- Collected \$13,175,025.50 in current and/or past due child support.
- Child Support Services are available to all adults.

Foster Care and Adoption

- The Collaborative Foster Care Program (CFCP) is a joint venture between Douglas, Arapahoe, and Jefferson Counties to assure that foster parents have adequate training, support and resources to promote the child's best interest.
- A total of 173 certified foster homes were served by the Collaborative Foster Care Program in 2024, with 71 of those homes being certified kinship homes.
- Douglas County finalized 17 adoptions.

Community Response Team


The Community Response Team (CRT), pairs a law enforcement officer with a mental health professional to help adults and youth experiencing a mental health crisis avoid the emergency room or jail and, instead, find the support they need to heal.

- ⇒ **160** Emergency Room Diversions
- ⇒ **17** Jail Diversions

Care Compact

The Care Compact (TCC) is an enhanced care coordination program that links existing case management and care coordination service providers. The Care Compact supports individuals with mental health, substance use disorder or intellectual and developmental disability (IDD) needs.

- ⇒ The Adult Care Compact enrolled **51** clients and provided **470** services.
- ⇒ The Youth Care Compact Pilot Program enrolled **nine** clients and provided **56** services.

SNAP: The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) helps low-income households in Colorado purchase food. In 2024, the SNAP program had a 73% increase in clients served.	7,167	17,006
Colorado Works/TANF: Colorado Works is Colorado's Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program. Through the program, participants receive help becoming self-sufficient by strengthening their family's economic and social stability. In 2024, TANF had a 31% increase in yearly applications.	1,784	746
Adult Financial Programs: Colorado's Adult Financial Programs include the Aid to the Needy Disabled-Colorado Supplement program, the Aid to the Needy Disabled-State Only program, the Burial Assistance Program, the Old Age Pension program, the Home Care Allowance program, and the Personal Needs Allowance program.		449

- ⇒ 98 new child welfare cases were opened in 2024.
- ⇒ There was an average of **145** open/active child welfare cases each month in 2024.
- ⇒ There was an average of **247** children/youth involved in open cases each month.
- There was an average of 17 youth actively receiving services through a Youth in Transition Case each month in 2024. These cases assist eligible foster youth by allowing them to voluntarily continue receiving certain child welfare services until the end of the month of their 21st birthday. This support is designed to assist them in successfully transitioning into adulthood.
