Trail Rating

- Easy and accessible
- Gravel detours on roadways and livestock gates are minor obstacles
- Enjoy cottonwoods, willows and grasslands along the trail

Trail Length

- Approximately 17 miles (will be a total of 24 miles once completed)
- Parallels Cherry Creek and will eventually connect Cherry Creek State Park to the north and Castlewood Canyon State Park to the south. Connects parks and open space properties, as well as Parker, Centennial and Franktown. This trail is a part of the Colorado Front Range Trail.

Trail Surface

- Finished portions have 8-foot-wide concrete surfaces
- Some detour connections are gravel (approximately 1.5 miles of gravel)

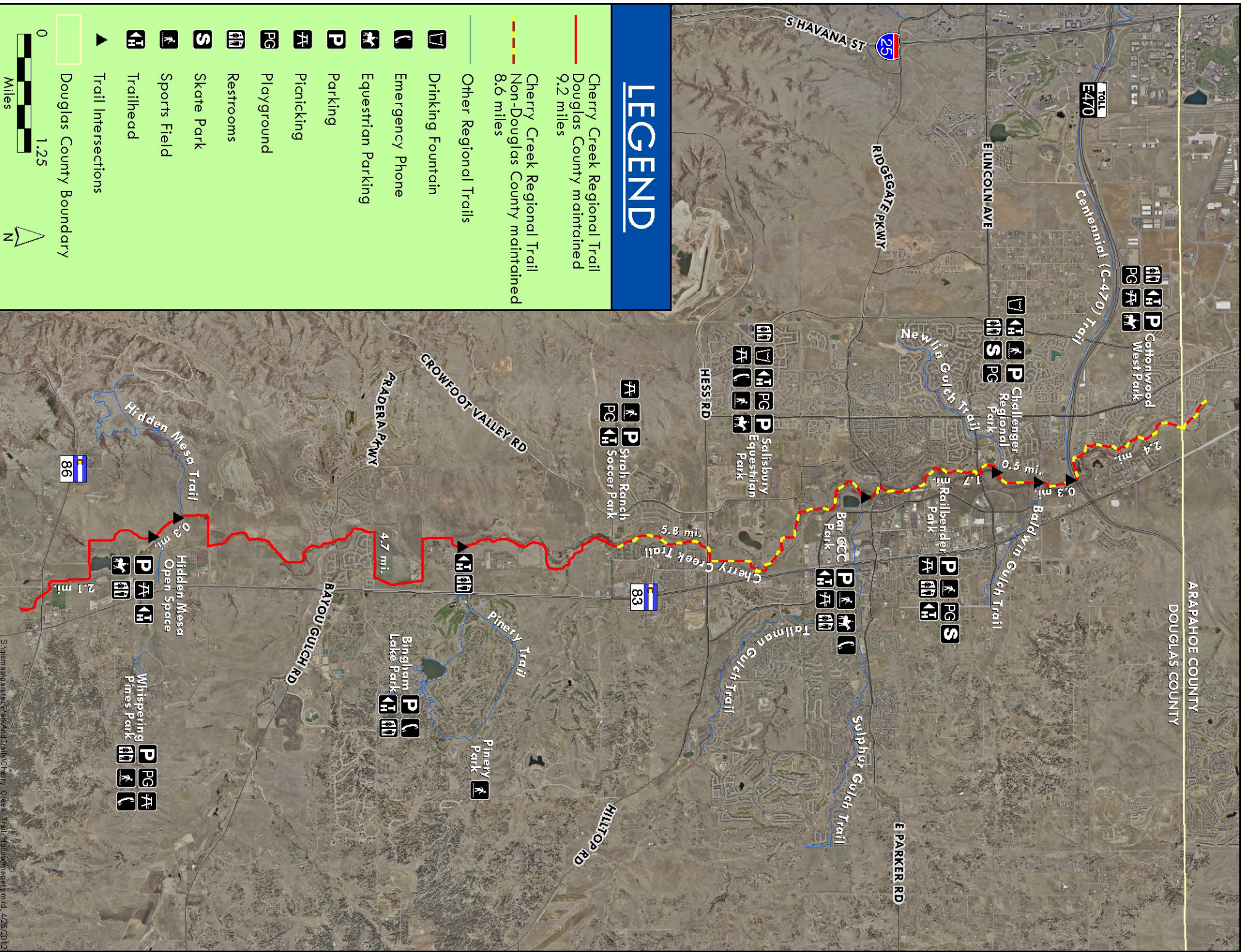
