


Greenland Trail

General Information
 The Greenland Trail provides 11 miles of hiking and riding through rolling grasslands, shrubland and pines. Views are of buttes, Pikes Peak, Rampart Range, and thousands of acres of protected open space. The trail is rated moderate; quite easy, but long.

Respect Wildlife and Grazing Cattle
 You will be sharing the pastures and trail of historic Greenland Ranch, so be sure to relock any gates that you open and keep your animals leashed at all times.

The Colorado Front Range Trail
 Is part of the Greenland Trail along the Old Territorial Road. It continues south as the New Santa Fe Trail, and north from the Greenland Trailhead 1/2 mile to Greenland Road, following the trail west of the RR tracks to Larkspur.

Amenities
 Trailhead area accommodates horse trailers, porta-potties, a horse obstacle course and arena, a dog off-leash area and obstacle, and a picnic shelter.

Directions
 1560 E. Noe Road, Larkspur, Co
 From I-25, take the Greenland Exit (167) to the west. Go for about a mile to the Greenland Trailhead.
