Subject: Zebulon Sports Complex Planning Update

SUMMARY

On June 17, 2025, Sterling Ranch provided a conceptual plan for the first phase of the Zebulon Sports Complex. Staff would like to review and discuss the latest Zebulon Sport Complex conceptual plan to see if aligns with the Board's expectation and vision.

BACKGROUND

The County is now leading the development of the first phase of the Zebulon Sport Complex. KT Development is no longer an equity partner and is planning to bid on the design-build of the Zebulon Sports Complex. The first phase focuses exclusively on the Zebulon Sports Complex and does not include the other Zebulon components considered at Burns and Providence parks. A County staff-led project will provide greater opportunities to reflect the vision and expectations of the Board.

DISCUSSION

With the shift to a County-led project, the primary focus will be on Phase I of the sports complex to serve as the catalyst for the future phases of development. The following is a summary of the Phase 1 programming as shown on the June 17, 2025 Conceptual Plan.

- ± 54 acres in size
 - ± 5.5 acres of indoor sports complex for basketball and volleyball, including ice rinks and arena
 - ± 3.7 acre sports dome for baseball, football, and soccer
 - ± 28 acres of soccer and baseball facilities
 - Plazas, greenways, paths, circulation, and parking

The County heard from baseball, football, tennis, and swimming organizations who are interested in the programming of Zebulon. The private organizations have funds but not the land to build facilities. The opportunity of privately funded facilities potentially decreases the County's overall expenditure in the Zebulon Sport Complex and would require evaluation to determine the potential impact of the financial participation.

Private sports organizations may have sufficient funding to build a facility, but not to fund its ongoing operations and maintenance. Sports organizations may also limit or eliminate the meaningful opportunities for the public to use the proposed facilities. Public access may be negotiated with the sports organization and may be dependent on the County's participation in the facility. The operation of the facility, either private or public, would need to be negotiated with the sports organization and funded through taxes or facility rental and use fees.

As the first phase of the Zebulon Sports Complex gets under way, other private sports organizations may come forward to participate.

Three separate, but related tasks are in process to support the proposed first phase of the Zebulon Sports Complex.

- 1. A renegotiated property exchange with SR Acquisitions, LLC for the Chemours parcel
- 2. Infrastructure and transportation improvements to serve EVOC and Zebulon
- 3. Location and Extent for DCSO EVOC, Wildfire Heli-Tac, and Search and Rescue facility

NEXT STEPS

Staff is prepared to discuss the expectation and vision for the Zebulon Parks and Phase 1 of the Zebulon Sports Complex.
