## WHAT TO KNOW

- **Registered Democrats** receive the Democratic Primary/Vacancy Election ballot.
- **Registered Republicans** receive the Republican Primary/Vacancy Election ballot.
- **Unaffiliated voters** receive two Primary/Vacancy Election ballots, one Democratic and one Republican but must vote and return **ONLY ONE**.
- **Minor Party** voters not participating in a Primary Election will only receive the Vacancy Election ballot.

## WHAT'S ON THE BALLOT?

- **Republican and Democratic Primary ballots** will each have candidates for Federal, State, and County offices. The winner of each contest will appear on the November General Election ballot.
- **Each Primary ballot also includes the SPECIAL CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT 4 VACANCY ELECTION.** The winner of this election will serve the rest of the unexpired term for United States Congress District 4, starting in July 2024 and ending in January 2025.
- **NOTE:** Effective January 7, 2025, Douglas County moves from the 18th Judicial District to the newly created 23rd Judicial District. As a result, candidates on the ballot for the office of District Attorney will now be listed for the 23rd Judicial District.



## REMEMBER:

Unaffiliated voters must vote and return

**ONLY ONE**

**ballot and securely dispose of the ballot not used. If two voted ballots are returned, none of the ballots will count.**
