Announcing the County's School Safety and Mental Health for Students Funding Decisions



Summary: Youth Community Response Team - \$331,000 ongoing Launched Nov. 18, 2019

- Team includes a mental health clinician, a specially trained DCSO Deputy, and a case manager.
- Designed to complement the efforts of schools to address mental health and suicide prevention.
- Collaborates with the school, family and student to develop a safety plan and next steps and coordinates ongoing care for students.
- Serves Douglas County High School and Highlands Ranch area schools pilot area covers approximately 70% of students.




Summary: School Resource Officers (SRO) - \$3 million ongoing

SROs from the Douglas County Sheriff's Office are assigned to schools in unincorporated areas of the County and are committed to keeping students safe and secure in their learning environments.

SROs 2018/2019 = 11





SROs 2019/2020 = 26



Summary: \$9 million for Physical School Safety* \$7.68 million - School Applicants \$1.33 million - Innovation/Emerging Technology Contingency

Every school requesting safety resources received funding from the county.

- Communication
 Training
- Access control
- Enhanced Building Security

*To ensure our schools are not made vulnerable, specific security details are protected by state law and will remain confidential.



Summary: \$990,000 Mental Health/Social Emotional Learning

100% of eligible funding requests were approved.

- School climate and culture assessments
- Social emotional learning curriculum that builds resiliency, addresses bullying and builds positive social emotional skills and connections
- Suicide prevention and intervention programming
- Mental health supports and interventions that build on existing programming
- Mental Health First Aid and related training for staff, parents and students



Summary: \$13.3 Million Distribution*

Physical School Safety

Funding Distributed to all School Applicants = \$7.68 million (one-time) Innovation & Emerging Technology Contingency = \$1.33 million (one-time)

Mental Health/Social Emotional Learning

Funding Distributed to all School Applicants = \$990,000 (one-time)

Total = \$10 million (one-time)

Youth Community Response Team = \$331,000 (ongoing)

School Resource Officers = \$3 million (ongoing)


Total = \$13.3 million
