


The Douglas Community Wildfire Protection Plan was collaboratively developed. Interested parties, including Douglas County communities, fire protection districts servicing Douglas County, Douglas County Public Works, Douglas County Wildfire Mitigation Staff, Douglas County Emergency Management, Douglas County Open Space and Natural Resources, US Forest Service-South Platte Ranger District, and the Colorado State Forest Service participated and provided input to the process and document.

The CWPP identifies and prioritizes areas for hazardous fuel reduction treatments and recommends the types and methods of treatment that will help to protect wildland urban interface areas of Douglas County. It also recommends measures to reduce the ignitability of structures throughout the area.

The following community representatives/agencies have reviewed and support this Community Wildfire Protection Plan.






