

## Suffix Rules

Suffixes are determined upon evaluation of the street alignment and in accordance with rules recommended by the Denver Regional Council of Governments (DRCOG). See page 12 of the Douglas County Addressing and Street Naming Manual, items 7.3.a. through 7.3.j. ### AVENUE DRIVE

7.3.a. Streets running east/west may take the suffix "Avenue" or "Drive."

### STREET

7.3.b. Streets running north/south may take the suffix "Street."

### PLACE

7.3.c. Cul-de-sacs running east/west may take the suffix "Place."

### COURT WAY

7.3.d. Cul-de-sacs running north/south may take the suffix "Court" or "Way."

### CIRCLE LOOP

7.3.e. Horseshoe-shaped, or other loop-shaped, streets that have beginning and ending points connecting to the same street may take the suffix "Circle" or "Loop."

### BLVD

7.3.f. Arterials running north/south may take the suffix "Boulevard."

### PWKY

7.3.g. Arterials running east/west may take the suffix "Parkway."

### ROAD LANE TRAIL

7.3.h. Through streets may take the suffix "Road," "Lane," or "Trail."

### HWY

7.3.i. Streets created by a government entity may take the suffix "Highway."

### POINT

7.3.j. Cul-de-sacs running in either direction may take the suffix "Point."
