

DOUGLAS COUNTY'S RETAIL THEFT ORDINANCE

What you need to know.

Colorado law requires anyone who has knowledge a crime has been committed to report that crime to law enforcement.

If you witness a crime or know a crime has been committed, please contact law enforcement by:

- ✓ Douglas County law prohibits corporate policies and business practices that prevent reporting retail theft.
- ✓ Douglas County law requires businesses retain evidence of a known crime.
- ✓ Douglas County law prohibits employers from retaliating against an employee that reports a crime.
- ✓ Douglas County law does not punish individuals who fail to timely report a crime.
- ✓ Fast, easy reporting.

Current state law:

It is the duty of every corporation or person who has reasonable grounds to believe that a crime has been committed to report promptly the suspected crime to law enforcement authorities. When acting in good faith, such corporation or person shall be immune from any civil liability for such reporting or disclosure.



It is everyone's responsibility to inform law enforcement when a crime has been committed.
